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#### PRESIDENT'S REPORT 2017 - 2018



This financial year has been one of growth and increased success for our Association. We have strengthened our relationships with Parks Victoria and DELWP and this can be evidenced by the work we have undertaken together. We are now having more regular meetings across our respective networks and work closely in a large number of areas. These include the traditional activities we have undertaken for many years such as Camp Host, Track Clearing and Clean Up the Bush weekends. Wayne and I attended the Ministerial Advisory Committee many times and over the past year, we successfully created a five-year Strategic Plan for Four Wheel Driving in Victoria. This is a great achievement and this plan has been endorsed by government. Our challenge collectively is to make this strategy come alive and work has well and truly commenced.

Our success has been demonstrated financially as well. We have moved forward with the grants given by government and have already commenced negotiations to have this renewed after next year. Our training has been very successful and generates a good income for the Association. This has enabled us to keep affiliation fees at the same level as previous years. The Association needs to stand on its merits financially and as a Board we believe we can do this successfully. We have managed our expenses whilst at the same time we've grown our income from sources other than affiliation fees. All the staff and the Board and now very aware of what it means to be financially prudent.

We also approved the appointment of a training consultant during the year. The aim of this appointment was to do the work necessary to ensure our RTO was compliant and this was the brief we gave the consultant. At the end of the 2017 calendar year this contract finished but we were aware that there was still a lot to be done. At the start of 2018 we appointed, on a part time basis, a new consultant with more specific RTO experience. This has resulted in the RTO moving closer to being fully compliant with the target for this being January 2019. This will ensure the RTO can successfully pass any audits from ASQA, the governing body. Whilst this work has been undertaken, we have been attempting to keep an RTO committee going. This proved problematic with distance being the main culprit. Most of the work that was required has been brought back into the office and as well there is a great deal of effort being made to ensure that our instructors are being looked after. This will strengthen even more over the coming year.

For those of you at the last Annual General Meeting, I gave a report on the National Council activities. This triggered quite a few questions and requests from a number of clubs who were seeking answers to questions from the National Body. Specifically, we asked the National Body for Financial Information (audited reports for the last three years), information from the minutes of meetings and for a statement describing the benefits we as club members receive for our contributions. This information was not forthcoming and so at the October 2018 Annual General meeting of the National Body, I will give in our resignation as a state from that body. This means that for the foreseeable future we will have little to do with the National Body on a formal basis. I will be presenting the end of year financials at that meeting as I was appointed Treasurer earlier in the year. I will be stepping down from this role as we no longer have a delegate position.

The Board and I believe that this decision is in the Association's best interest and we have already commenced work on strengthening our relations with peak bodies nationally such as the AAAA and various manufacturers. We see that our relationship with government in Victoria is critical and will also focus on developing this even further. Going forward, it is anticipated that we will also work closely with other government departments who have an interest in what we are able to do such as tourism.

On a personal note, my two-year term as President concludes at the AGM and I do not intend standing for that position for the next term. I have expressed a desire to take on another position on the Board should I be elected. The past twelve months has been challenging personally and I feel that I need a break from such an important position. I'd like to thank my fellow Board members for making my job as easy as it could be. I'll miss some of the work we've begun but intend staying in the loop. I'd also like to thank Wayne who I get along very well with and consider him to be a great friend. The staff in the office also should get a great round of applause for their efforts, Alison, Karl, Dave and more recently Sheila and Ian.

I believe the Association now has a strong foundation upon which to build a great future. I'd like to think that all our club members believe this, and I'll see you in the bush and on the many activities planned for the future.

#### CEO'S REPORT 2017 - 2018



What an incredible year it has been for us this year in many ways. I reported last year that we had become more self-reliant in terms of our financial position and actual managerial structure, we have lifted the bar again throughout this year. Our expansion in the form of a permanent Training Manager to look after the RTO compliance issues and a Project Officer to bring us into the modern age of social media has increased our profile enormously in a very short time frame.

Reading our financial position will give you an idea of what we have been striving to achieve and by adding these extra personnel it has allowed us to move forward on a very positive note to reach the goals we have set for ourselves as well meeting the KPI's around the government funding we are fortunate enough to have procured. This funding once again is a direct result of the quantifiable volunteer activities undertaken by our associated clubs and their generous members, gathered and collated into a report which is presented to the government and their land managers twice a year as prescribed under our agreement. Thank you all for taking the time to record the requested information and a huge thank you to Geoff Kenafacke for chasing, collecting and sorting the volumes of data offered. His efforts in this regard have been ongoing now for the last four years or so and I greatly appreciate his assistance.

I can't express enough how high we are held in esteem by the government and their land managers only to say that it gives me great delight to hear those people speak so highly of how we contribute to the state in so many ways, setting examples for others to follow and aspire to. To be asked to attend and sit on committees which are examining the use of the state's landscape is a good indication of the respect shown to us for the contribution we have made in this space over many years.

Our request for funding for the next three years has been put into the Minister's office and has been received with positive overtures we are told so we expect this will be forthcoming once again. This along with the strengthening RTO position and workflow gives us the confidence to explore other opportunities in the corporate area which will only enhance our overall position both financially and in the broader training sector.

We have been actively quoting and delivering courses during the last twelve months at a steady rate and indications are this will continue into this financial year judging by the request for quotes we are currently experiencing. Our RTO update days this year have been well attended with interesting topics and vehicle inspections being good drawcards to bring this about. Our training policies and procedures about the casual contracts now in place, have tightened up our employment terms and conditions which was a necessary step to not only ensure our ATO obligations but also to reward the instructors with extra benefits not seen before. We look forward to attracting more qualified and willing trainers to help our increasing workload.

We have once again made the final three in the Regional Achievement Awards in the Parks Victoria Environmental Sustainability Award for our Clean Up the Bush effort in the Smythesdale region back in April this year. We will know shortly how we fared this year but it is still quite an honor to reach the finalist position given the amount of entries submitted to these awards. Once again, a wonderful accolade to those who took the time and effort to assist in this worthwhile event. We plan to do another of these events early in the new year when a suitable location is found.

Despite our growing age demographic, we are steadily growing in numbers of clubs associating with us having moved on from last years 81 to now being well in advance of that. We are starting to attract some of the facebook clubs who are seeing the need for an association which works towards keeping the tracks open and allowing us to utilize the landscape as we all would like to. Let's keep up the positive educational promotion of what we are about and invite those not yet with us to join our association and build our numbers which in turn helps bring a result we are all seeking.

Based on our Memorandum of Understanding with both the Department of Environment, Land, Water and Planning (DELWP) and Parks Victoria (PV), we have been invited to assess several tracks throughout the year to determine the risk factors and discuss whether closures, be it permanent, temporary or seasonal need to occur. The main consideration here is always the mitigation of the risk from all types of aspects which may result in possible litigation against those responsible for the management of the region in question. We advocate to keep the tracks open of course but must be very mindful of the general publics safety and wellbeing given that the lowest common denominator will always influence the outcome in the use of the landscape.

Finally, I would like to thank the people I work with in the office for their incredible support and commitment, Alison McLaughlin, Karl Norman, Sheila Douglas, Ian Fletcher and Dave Roberts who have made my job a lot easier and certainly more enjoyable.

#### TREASURER'S REPORT 2017 - 2018



I am pleased to present the Annual Financial Statements for the Victorian Association of Four Wheel Drive Clubs Inc. for the financial year ended 30 June 2018.

The Financial Statements have been prepared by Knox Taxation and Business Advisory and audited by Knox Tax and Business Advisory services.

The 2018 financial year has again been successful for the Association. The trading result for the 2018 financial year was a surplus of \$153,035 (2017: \$125,652 surplus). This result has continued the Associations positive net asset position in 2018 to \$470,634 (2017: \$318,598). In order to remain a viable Association, we must ensure we are in a financially sustainable position well into the future. That said, there will be other costs in the new financial year that are necessary to maintain our RTO standards. The forecast surplus for 2018-2019 is around \$77,000.

Again, the Finance Committee, consisting of Garry Doyle, Michael Martin, Gary Lyons, Ken Robinson and myself met regularly throughout the year ensuring the books were in order and the Association continued down a successful path. I sincerely thank those members for the hours of deliberating over financial reports, budgets and anything else that could potentially affect Four Wheel Drive Victoria (FWDV).

The Association has three pillars of revenue, being membership fees, driver (and other) training and Government funding in exchange for very specific key performance indicators (KPI).

The Government funding for 2017 was again \$250,000 which included provision for a Project Officer to assist in the delivery of agreed programs. The Government Funding was received in June 2018, enabling the Association to draw on these funds from 1st July, which is of great benefit to our cash flow. However, this Government funding is not guaranteed into the future. The Association continues to provide highly valued services to the Land Managers, working to ensure that funding does continue.

Training revenues were up 54% from 2017, as a direct result of the work of FWDV CEO Wayne Hevey. This is the second year we have experienced a great increase in this revenue source and the budget for 2018-2019 has been developed with yet another increase, albeit small. Our RTO status ensures that the Association provide certified training courses to clubs and commercial organisations. A focus on this area will allow training revenues to continue over the next 12 months.

Membership fees increased slightly from the 2017 result (about 2%) and despite an ageing demographic the Association continues to attract new members and clubs. Our 2018-19 budget includes funds to further promote the Association both within the Melbourne metropolitan area and in the regional areas to actively work towards attaining higher levels of membership.

Again, I would like to thank Karl Norman for his efforts in answering my endless requests for reports and other figures, all of the office staff and every member of the Board. My sincere thanks for that and I wish you all well for the future.

#### **Note 1: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

The financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Association Incorporations Reform Act 2012. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial statements has been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

#### Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Leasehold improvements and office equipment's are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held and ready to use.

Leasehold improvements are amortized over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

#### Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the committee reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognized in the income and expenditure statement.

#### **Employee Provisions**

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee provisions have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

#### **Provisions**

Provisions are recognized when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

#### Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash on hand included cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

#### Accounts receivable and Other Debtors

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

#### Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognizing revenue.

Interest revenue is recognized using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognized when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

If conditions are attached to the grant that must be satisfied before the association is eligible to receive the contribution, recognition of the grant as revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

#### Leases

Leases of PPE, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset (but not the legal ownership) are transferred to the association, are classified as finance leases.

Finance leases are capitalized by recording an asset and a liability at the lower of the amounts equal to the fair value of the lease property or the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for that period.

Lease assets are depreciated on a straight-line basis over the shorter of their estimated useful lives or the lease term. Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charges as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

#### Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amounts of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the assets and liabilities statement.

#### **Financial Assets**

Investments in financial assets are initially recognised at cost, which includes transaction costs, and are subsequently measured at fair value, which is equivalent to their market bid price at the end of the reporting period. Movements in fair value are recognised through an equity reserve.

#### **Accounts Payable and Other Payables**

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.
