The Association has by all measures had a successful and constructive year.

Financially we are in a strong position, and this is due to the diligence and governance of the board as a whole. On that note I would also like to thank Doug Mitchell for volunteering to join the board as our new treasurer. As an experienced accountant Doug brings a wealth of knowledge which will be an asset for the Association. He replaces Garry Doyle who resigned some months ago to get more involved with the National Association.

The financial position of the Association is also a reflection of the growing revenue contribution the RTO is making to the Association, particularly from commercial entities. The Board made a decision a couple of years ago to invest in the RTO with an external review of its compliance and training delivery, and has since employed a part time Training Manager. Thanks to the work undertaken by our Training Manager, we now have an RTO which is compliant in its training delivery, has automated its on line training registration process for students, has a pool of qualified trainers to call on who are paid as professionals, and is planning expanding its training offering.

The Association exists because of its members Clubs and has done so for some 40 years. With around 90 Member Clubs the Association, which continues to grow, provides not just representation to government on four wheel driving, but club training, governance support, and track and access advise. In return the Clubs and their members do volunteering work delivering a number of very successful programmes. Consequently the Association receives funding from the Government around the delivery of KPI's, which again have been achieved.

The other key focus for the Association has been as a member of the Ministerial Advisory Committee. This has also seen the Association invited to be a parts of the VEAC review. With a Strategic Plan spanning the next four years, the Government has allocated \$10.5m funding, to support park access and use. The Association is working closely with the Land Managers in order to deliver the outcomes identified, which will to be supported by Market Research due to be completed shortly.

In summary I would like to thank not just the members of the Board for their contribution to the Association, but also our CEO Wayne Hevey and his staff for their support and commitment.

And finally our Clubs and their Members who are the Association. Without their support there would be no Association. Thank you.

The 2018 - 2019 period has been an incredibly busy time for all of us here in the office of FWDV. Our KPI report to the Minister from the end of last years activities continued to show the incredible workload you our members are willing to commit to and produce to the tune of 14,300 volunteer hours. This along with the extra community-based activities including outings for the less fortunate and terminally ill individuals and their families, highlights once again the dedication and concern for the community our association members have for others. I can assure you all that this does not go unnoticed by those in high positions within government and their land managers.

Our board has seen a couple of changes over the last twelve months with Garry Doyle stepping down as Treasurer to move into the National Association body, replaced recently by Doug Mitchell CPA, a recently retired accounting business owner and a former board member from a previous time. Doug has already imparted valuable knowledge to our meetings, we look forward to working with him into the future with our other members.

I reported last year that our funding request had been put in early due to the election occurring in November 2018, I am pleased to report that this was successful, we now have a much stronger financial base to work from not forgetting we still need to continue delivering on our KPI's. This effort is of course to ensure that in the very near future we will are able to demonstrate we can function independently as is our mandate to become self-reliant. Rest assured that the board and I are striving to make positive moves to enhance our financial position for the betterment of the association, well into the future.

On this note once again I personally would like to thank Geoff Kenafacke who has now retired from his job as our collator of all volunteer hours and activities, due to health issues, a task he has performed brilliantly over the last five years or so. His efforts will be sadly missed by us all in the office.

Our RTO has been moving along with great progress thanks to our team in the office and our instructors, we are now advertising and taking bookings for courses online and soon hope to have the theory sessions carried out completely from an online base structure. A slight hiccup has just occurred whereby all our sports industry courses were eliminated from our scope but through some wonderful concerted efforts from all our office staff, we have now got back on track with the forestry products prescribed for our industry. We are looking to increase our workload in the RTO space striving to bring greater value to the association through this income stream which in turn relates to our self-reliance objectives. We currently have an application sitting with the DELWP and Hume Shire to obtain a license or lease to occupy a disused quarry in the Toolangi region which we hope to be utilizing shortly as a training facility. This will enable us to potentially control our own destiny with regards holding training courses whilst keeping our outgoings to a minimum but also being somewhere our member clubs can run courses also.

Over the last financial year, we have been invited as a major stakeholder group, to sit on various different committees, the Central West Investigation, Regional Forests Agreements, Grampians Landscape Management Plan, Parks Victoria Land Management Strategy Group as well as our continuing work on the Mt Stirling/Mt Buller Stakeholder Group which we have been involved in for two years or so.

The importance and significance of these appointments plus the continued volunteer efforts performed by us cannot be understated as illustrated by the recent announcement



from the Premier that \$10.5m would be allocated and spent on the upgrading of 4wd tracks, campgrounds and facilities across the state over the next four years. Parks Victoria CEO, Matthew Jackson, commented that we were jointly responsible for this occurring and that Parks Victoria are working in conjunction with FWDV to bring these projects to fruition. Absolutely wonderful to get this recognition you would have to agree.

Our total number of member clubs has grown since June by 12 which gives us a tally of 92 at this present time and I would like to say that this is probably come about by our increased presence on the social media platform over the last year. We have managed to attract a number of face book clubs amongst these which is very encouraging whilst also new clubs are forming from specific vehicle models as well as a greater understanding and appreciation of our insurance and other direct benefits on offer.

The Mt Skene permit scheme is another driver in this instance and this year we can boast that there has been a very good season with regards the amount of snow, camaraderie and behavior shown all round. There was increased activity from the local authorities this season and thankfully no reports of wrongdoing from our members although not so from some other user groups.

New systems are being developed for updating & sending members list spreadsheets which will make it much simpler and more effective for the office to upload into the database which may require education in some areas. We are trying to improve our systems constantly allowing us to work smarter rather than harder and we will ask your assistance with this when the time arises. You will also see a newly formatted E-News report being sent to those email addresses we have where you will have the option of opting in or out, so if you don't receive this please contact the office so we have your details to let this happen.

Over the last twelve months we have been invited to assess the state of several tracks around the countryside showing the worth of our Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) and Standing Operating Procedures (SOP's) with both Parks Victoria and the Department of Environment, Land, Water and Planning. I have personally been asked to visit and make comment on the restitution of the Mt Joan Staircase on two occasions, the Barkly River Jeep Track the Butcher Country Track and more recently the Rubicon Trail Track which was being earmarked as an MVO track. Conversation is continuing with these as it is with Mt Joan and the Barkly River track.

Once again, I would like to thank my staff and friends I work with in the office for their support and assistance in making all things happen in the most professional way, every day;

TREASURER'S REPORT 2018 - 2019



I am pleased to present the Annual Financial Statements for the Victorian Association of Four Wheel Drive Clubs Inc. for the financial year ended 30 June 2019.

The Financial Statements have been prepared by Knox Taxation & Advisory and audited by Knox Taxation & Advisory.

The 2019 financial year has been another success for the Association.

The trading result for the 2019 financial year was a \$123,200 surplus (2018: \$153,035 surplus). This result has helped to grow the Association's positive net asset position in 2019 to \$604,484 (2018:

\$470,364).

The sustained trading surplus in recent years is the result of the Association's commitment to its long-term future financial independence. However, building the Association's training capabilities and investment in intellectual property will reduce the forecasted surplus in the short term. Hence, the forecast surplus for the 2019-20 financial year is approximately \$80,000.

The Association has three pillars of revenue, being membership fees, Registered Training Organisation (RTO) training and the Government KPI funding.

The Government funding for 2019 was \$250,000 which included provision for a Project Officer to assist in the delivery of the agreed KPI programs. The Government Funding was received in June 2018, in advance for the 2018-19 financial year. The Association's member volunteers continue to provide important services to Land Managers, guaranteeing our partnership for the future.

Training income has increased 37% from 2018, which is a direct reward for the RTO improvements in policy, procedures and compliance over the past year.

Membership income has decreased \$10,000 from the 2018 result (due to the refund of National Council fees). Otherwise membership numbers are reasonably static with new clubs replacing losses from natural attrition.

I would like to thank the office team for their hard work over the past year, with a notably successful transition from MYOB to Xero accounting software.

Note 1: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporations Act. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

(a) Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

(b) Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the entity reviews the carrying values of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, is compared to the asset's carrying value. Any excess of the asset's carrying value over its recoverable amount is expensed to the income statement.

(c) Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee benefits have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

(d) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

(e) Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

(f) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Tax Office. In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the assets and liabilities statement are shown inclusive of GST.

(g) Trade and Other Payables

Trade and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period, which remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.
